

AAFP Position Statement

Welfare of shelter cats

The American Association of Feline Practitioners (AAFP) advocates for the wellbeing/welfare of shelterhoused cats based on the following Five Freedoms:

- 1 Freedom from hunger and thirst
- 2 Freedom from pain, illness and disease
- 3 Freedom from discomfort
- 4 Freedom from fear and distress
- 5 Freedom to perform species-specific behaviors

This Position Statement is intended to update and replace the AAFP's earlier '2009 Welfare of shelter cats' Position Statement.
